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## FOREWORD

In this publication, which is the result of 15 years of research, I would like to make the reader familiar with the application of the advanced methods in Mundane Astrology that I have already applled in my trilogy, Prediction I, II and III.

It is to the credit of Cyril fagan, Ne lson Page and Vendel Polich that research in astrology developed to a point beyond the dreams of most astrologers. My close collaboration with these distingulshed astrologers enabled me to refine their methods and make some new discoveries that were based on analogy as well as on new, independent findings.

Most of the astrological methods explained in this book can be handled with ease using the various computer programs that are now on the market for almost all computer systems. Thls appliesito all the methods that are explained in Prediction (I), Using Common and Prenatal Cycles, and which are connected with the Universal Transit System, such as Transits, Solar and Lunar Returns, and others.

Today, Polltical Astrology sulfers very much from the fact that there are only very few horoscopes of States with a secure recorded birth time. Ten well-authenticated and rectlfied Charts of some leading States published here should be a starting point fior astrologers who intend to work methodically on this matter.

A broad range of astronomically correct and astrologically effective systems will enable the reader to choose those tools with which he is acquainted For beginners 1 recommend the Universal Transit System demonstrated in my book Prediction(1). As can be seen in the demonstrated examples, satisfactory predictive work can be done when using various effective Cycles For advanced students, Prediction II, Directions and the art of Rectification should be a useful complement to work with approved Directions.

## THE AUTHLENTLCATLON OF ST.ATE 3LOROSCOPES

True and effectlve Blrth Charts for State Horoscopes have been, and stlll are, a serlous problem in Polltical Astrology. For Instance, there are dozens of charts that pretend to be the authentic horoscopes of the United States of America. In most cases of these welltknown dates, such as July 7, 1776, the true times have not been recorded. To identily a chart where only the birth date is known is very difficult, as astrologers will agree As the writer has often mentloned, experlence shows that the dellineation of a Birth Map alone is never a secure way to authenticate a birth time. This applles for so-called speculative birth times as well as for cases where we have the cholce between several doubtiul indicat lons.

The method for the authentication of a blrth time described below was originally applled for the horoscopes of Individuals, and later became valld also for State Horoscopes. It does not require any special trigonometrical knowledge, and gives results that make the chart workable in almost all disclplines of the Universal Transit system '. Its advantage lles in the fact that the anlysis can be performed with Personal Computers as well as with a pocket calculator. Depending on the number of events in the history of a state, results can be achleved that narrow down the time to a few minutes On the other hand this approximate identification of a chart means that the astrologer does not work on a totally fictional chart. which has often happened when astrologers relled on speculative birth charts that they constructed on a doubtiul dellneation of the map alone. The reader is advised to start his Investigations on State Horoscopes where the date and approximate time is guaranteed by witnesses or rellable, written records.

## Ruthenfication of a Birth Chart wilth the aid of Precessed Lunar Refuins.

We analyze the Birth Chart of the United Kingdom which came Into operat ion officlally on January 1, 1801, at 00 h LMT $=00 \mathrm{~h} 00 \mathrm{~m} 32 \mathrm{~s}$ U.T. (LONDON 0e W08; SION 30'). Fig. $\boldsymbol{B}$

(The writer recommends computer programs avallable from MATRIX Software, 315 Marlon Ave., BIg Rapids MI 49307, USA ).

The following method to analyse birth times is valid for any natal chart, whether there is a so called "dead - right ' time or not. In all cases where a sufficient number of events is available the following analysis gives a secure approximate birth time

Using the Table or Houses for London, 51 N 32 (In all Raphae) Ephemerides back to 1840) we get for $19 \mathrm{~h} 22 \mathrm{~m}, \mathrm{MC}=190$ Capricorn

A glance at the Ephemeris shows the SUN high in the sky near the MC on 159 Capricorn in opposition to the MOON, 20 Cancer $50^{\circ}$. Even retrospectively this is not a satisfactory indication for the death of a Queen, although we may say that the Sun is generally symbolizing the head of a State, and the MOON the people Again, other indications for the death, like the Descending Mean Node. SATURN and perhaps Pluto, do not have Cardinal positions in this Chart.

## Bule 1: The most effective Lunar Relurns for the choracteristics of an event are generally to be faund in charts the operational dates of which ore nearest to the euent.

These characteristics of any Precessed Lunar Return are very logical. because these charts reflect the psychological condtions and/or reactions of a native resulting from the main happenings in the operation period of the Cycle. In the present case, the operational date of the Precessed Lunar Chart happened to bell days before the event, within which events of a completely different character may have occured For this reason it is necessary to compute the Demi-Lunar in all those cases where it is available.

This necessity arrises when the main (full) Lunar Return precedes the event by more than 14 days. The DemHunar Aefurn has to be computed for the Ecliptical point in opposition to the Radical Moon in the present instance it is $19^{9}$ Capricom $26^{\prime}$.

In the Lunar Return above the writer has demonstrated the procedure in detail to show the astronomical connections. In practice, mainly when operating with Ephemerides, the computation process may be shortened with the following simplified method:

As the coordinates used for London are almost the same as those for Greenwich (difference $=32 \mathrm{~s}$ ), It may be neglected here. Both planets are close to the IC, the lowest point of the Horoscope. These planets are accompanied by the MOON.
Interpretation: Saturn, the characteristic planet for death and mourning Is within one degree of the IC. VENUS on the IC symbolizes the Queen, and the Moon (conjunct Saturn) the mourning population.

This retrospective interpretation might have been a prognostic one if Queen Victoria had previously suffered from a serious illness.

Rule 2: The most characteristic Indicatians in Lunar Beturns are Planets near the Angles of the Chart.
Ruic 3: Secondly, for the character of the event, the shape of the Horoscope may play a conslderable role.

In the present case the psychological conditions shown in this map are very discouraging and depressing indeed as seven planets are under the horizon, and are besides assembled on the weakest point of the Horoscopethe IC. The IC also symbolizes weakness, especially if, as here, the Sun is near the IC or in the 4th House
Refined computation with a sophisticated computer program gives a SATURN conjunction with the IC, which in the Ecliptic as well as in RIght Ascension has an orb of only a few minutes of arc.

## Bule 4: with main events, characteristic planets for the event tend to oppear very close to on Ringle, preferably with an ort under two degrees.

In this Chart the SUN is high in the sky near the MC - the active authorities of the State. The close conjunctions of NEPTUNE with the SUN and MC could have shown vagueness and confusion over the German attack on Holland and Belgium. The Ultimatum sent to Germany on August 4, is very convincingly shown by the almost exact MOON-MERCURY conjunction with the MC. However the actual declaration of war is not yet evident. It is very persuasively shown in the Demi-Lunar Chart, which is 13 days closer to the event. Aug. 4, 1914 gn 16m 36 s UT Fig. 2旦_Here Rule 1 (above) again comes fully into operation.

In this Demi-Lunar the great efficacy of PARAN's becomes very evident. Parans are Mundane Aspects of planets, the aspects having small orbs. They are measured in Right Ascension at the MC and IC, in Oblique Ascension (OA) on the ASC, and in Oblique Descension (OD) on the DESC. The, computation of Parans (mundane planetary positions) is explained in Prediction 1, pages 115-117.
in our case we get the following effective Parans which symbolize the outbreak of war and its declaration on Germany by Great Britain:
Pluto nas its strongest possible position - almost exact on the MC and in Mundane (Paran) and Ecliptical conjunction with Saturn (worries) It symDolizes the shock and the completely new situation (war). Very persuasive also is the Paran of MOON (4) and MERCURY ( 10 ) This Mundane opposition happens to be in Cardinal Houses and has an orD of only $41 \mathrm{~s}\left(10^{\prime}\right.$ of arc) It is undoubtedly characteristic for the Ultimatum as well as for the declaration of war The actual indication for the outbreak of war however is shown by the Ecliptical and Mundane conjunction (Paran) of Venus and Mars just above the Ascendant. While Venus/Mars combinations are typical for hostilfties and the outbreak of wars. Mars is sometimes replaced by Pluto.

full 5, The masimum power of Parans appears on Angles and House Cusps. Their efficacy deminishes rapidly when their positions become distant from the Cusps. This applles to Cyclic Charis as well as to Birth Charts. (See, Interpretation of USSA I below)

Parans that do not obey this Rule should be neglected, though they are offered in some commercial computer programs.

For the authentication of State Horoscopes the writer recommends analyzing mainly deaths of rulers of States, outbreaks of wars, decisive battles and peace treaties. As experlence shows, in all astrological systems these events always demonstrate the utmost effectiveness. In fact, events of this kind affect the whole population. Although the deaths of monarchs do not neccessarlly have a strong effect on the population, they are very easy to infer because the death itself is always bound to a limited number of planetary symbols. On the other hand, events connected with wars are in most cases linked to more numerous symbols through being connected with a variety of circumstances. The same applles to peace treaties. The following Lunar Returns should demonstrate this.

The above demonstrated Lunar Returns and their Deml's showed with appropriate pianets on the Angles that we have to deal with an authenticated birth time that is very close to the given one. Naturally, in this case we had to deal with a State Horoscope that went into operation at a time fixed Deforehand As we shall see later, the authentication of State Horoscopes with known dates and unknown times is much more difficult.

Final proofs should give the Primary and Secondary Directions in the Topocentric System. In the present case these can not only acknowledge the given tlme but, vice versa, also prove the true effectiveness of these Directions.

In the IIsted events MARS appears with its spmbolism for war. The SUN and SATURN are for male monarchs, the MOON for female monarchs.
URANUS, as a dominant planet in the Radix in most cases symbolizes the effect of surprise, and, if in neutral or harmonlous aspects (as here the close sextile to Radical JUPITER) the lucky cutcome of enterprises.
The 9th Cusp in State Horoscopes refers to dominating events where forelgn countries are involved (polltics, wars, etc.)
The 12th Cusp, appearing with MARS for the abdication of Edward VIII is a Significator here of compulsion and humlliation.
The MC, IC, ASC and DESC have a wide spectrum., especially in State Horoscopes.

## Solar Eclipses the Destiry Makers of States

While in birth charts of Individuals Solar Ecilipses do not play a dominant role, in State Horoscopes they seem to produce destiny in Its purest sence. This is logical because Solar Ecllpses, Lunar Eclipses and Lunations are charts of purely mundane character.

The writer has already emphasized In Prediction I that only those Lunations and Eclloses are worthwhile analyzing where they touch Angles or planets of the chart with a relatively smal orb.

There is still disagreement whether these phenomena have to be measured on the Ecliptic or In Right Ascension. However, experlence mainly with PLUTO, a planet reaching high latitudes, confirmed the tradtional teaching: The correct measurement is the Ecliptical one.

Further, the question arises whether the efficacy of an occultation for certain parts of the world is increased if these parts are directly touched by the occultation. So far the writer has not made any distInction between the different occultations, such as total or partial eclipses, or which parts of our globe are affected by it and which not. On the other hand this questionseems to be more relevant in Mundane Charts that are not related to nativities but to geographic coordinates, in the same manner as Sun and Moon Ingresses into the Tropical Signs.

## RULE 6: Lunatlons and Eclipses are highly efficaclous only if they touch the Angles or planets of the Notal Chart. Oppositions also are ualld, but have less efficacy.

They are valld in the following order of effectiveness: Conjunctions and Oppositions of the Lunation or Eclipse with:
(a) One of the Angles (orb within approximately 2 degrees)
(b) One of the Luminarles (orb within approximately 1.5 degrees)
(c) One of the planets or the Mean Ascending or Descending Node (orD within approximately ( degree ).

The Chart itself must be judged in the same way as an ordinary Cyclis Chart, provided that the points (a) to (c) are satisfied.

Extenslve research with State Horoscopes revealed that in long time periods with an unusual quantity of decisive happenings.we can observe an unusual frequency of effective Solar Eclipses that sometimes cont inuously reinforce each other.

Of some interest here is a comparison of this frequency in the demonstrated chart of the United KIngdom.
From February 1803 to January 1815 there nappened to be nine nighly effective Solar Eclipses which all touched Angles or planets of the United Kingdom's Birth Chart. If we compare this ?requency with other 12-year perlods, we find that ecilpses that fulfil the above mentioned conditions are quile rare.

## Prenatal Lunations and Edupses

As repeatedly demonstrated, our Transit System with all its Cycllc Charts has an equivalent complement - the prenatal Transit System ${ }^{2}$
Exhaustive research into prenatal eclipses has revealed that they are equally as effective as the relevant common charts. As demonstrated below, eventiul periods in the history of the Unit ed Kingdom are reflected in these converse charts with the same quantity and quallty.
for the United Kingdom's most eventiul time period during the first fifteen years of tis existence, demonstrated with common Solar Eclipses, there are 7 Prenatal Solar Ecllpses that fulfil the conditions given in Rule 6 Here are seven or the most effective ones:

# Prenatal Edipses and Lursatilors <br> Computation and Significence 

Prenatal Transits are usually computed to the day and to the time in hours, minutes and, eventually, seconds, (for Muridian distances in Oblique Ascension and MDO's) ${ }^{3}$. For Eclipses and Lunations the rollowing approximate, simplifled method is always sufficient.

EMAMPLE A: United Kingdom, as above, I801, January 1.

Example A is valld for the computation of all sorts of Prenatal Cycles.

The above method of tracing prenatal dates( A ), or to find operational postnatal dates ( $B$ ) is especially useful for dates that are very far back. For prenatal dates that are in the reach of the 19 th century (1800-) I recommend the Prenatal Transit Tables ${ }^{4}$

We have already leamed that all correct astrological systems have adequate prenatal complements ${ }^{2}$
To a great degree this concerns Ecllpses Prenatal elements are in general much more individualistic than postnatal ones because they are always different for individuals, and especially for horoscopes of States To lllustrate this, here is one example
Four people are killed instantly in a road accident.
The same translting planets in the sky at the time of the accident apply to all four Radices, whereas the Prenatal Iransits are entirely different for each one, because they depend on the birth dates and times of the people concerned.
The same applies to State Horoscopes, although we have spectal cases here in which the Postnatal Ecllpses showed an Impressive efficacy for all States concerned, If the different geographic coordinates of the Capltals are used. ${ }^{5}$
A problem, of course, is mass-catastropnles in which thousanas of people perish at the same moment (atom domb, earthquakes, etc). in this case. by simple logic. It would de difficult to rind satisiactory astrological Inalcations. This is a sort of supernatural problem that so far nas not been solved with the astrological tools at present avallable, and which is a very good argument of those sclentist who deny the valldity of astrology. Neverthe less, there should de an answer some time to this prodlem which touches mundane spheres of which we are not at present aware.

The writer originally had a very poor opinion of charts that nad deen fixed beforenand and came into force at mlonight. This glves for all States that nave been founded by Great Britain a Sun posit ton on the IC In general this maybe regarded as unfortunate, espectally if the Sun recelves unfavourable aspects, or if the chart has dominating malefics high in the sky.
In the United Kingdom's 1801 Chart it is different. The weak position of the Sun Is compensated dy a very dowerful Full Moon, high in the sky. close to the MC and in Its Domicile As frequently stated, the writer respects Domiclles, Dignities and Detriments of planets only in the Horoscopes of States and in those of people who have achleved world-wide importance. inis statement is an empirical result acnieved through the analysis of over 200 rectifled birth charts
Besides this, logic does not Dermit that, for instance, all people born within a considerably long time period with a couple of planets in Detriment have to suffer an unfortunate destiny. This applles mainly for malefics that remain in the Tropical Signs for years. It is oifferent especiaily in horoscopes of people who influenced or even changed the course of history Here the maleflcs as well as benefics have reflected events in accordance with their cosmic conditions (Hitler, Kennedy and others)

The very close sextlle of JUPITER in the 10th House to the dominat ing URANUS on the Ascendant may be regarded as the most favourable aspect In the Chart of the United Kingdom URANUS is the Inltiator of Britains successful conquests of large territories It also symbolizes the support of the United States, which helped England to Survive two Worlo Wars, as Uranus is in a close trine to the 9th Cusp (Topocentric), in Gemini. Both Uranus and Geminl are characterIstic for the Unlled States. These two factors are also favourable In West Berlin's chart ( Fig F)
The considerable number of wars that England had to endure, with varying results. Is symbolized by VENUS (Cusp 5 - hazards) In square to MARS. which is weakened in Taurus The close trine of URANUS and the close sextlle of JUPITER to CUS® 9 is favourable for communication with foreign countrles. On the other nand. the close sesuulquadrate of URANUS to VENUS could reflect that ifnally all the conquests' vanished through developments after peace (Venus) in 1945.
The financlal situation was at first favoured by the close trine of PLUTO to Cusp 2 (Scordio.lts Domicile) However, JUPITER the igeneral SIgnificator of wealth by its symbolism is in an almost exact square to Cusp 2 (Orb 2 of arc). Finances are now miserable will they, Improve through the PLUTO aspect and/or the close semisextlle of URANUS?
England is a Kingdom, but only in the domestic sense - SUN on the IC in the 4th House. As is well known, the monarct's in England have not the slightest executive power (SUN opposite the MC), which applles also for many States founded by the United KIngdom
NEPTUNE is in trine to the dominating MOON, and in a favourable Recedtlon (Scorplo. PIsces) with PLUTO. This might reflect England's successful deeds in most sea enterprises from Trafalgar(1805) to the occupation of the Falkland Islands (1982). Here the close Hldpoint of SUN/MC to NEPTUNE/ PLUTO could be of some Importance.

This brlef analysis of England's characteristics and developments since 1801 should as usual show that the main indications (priorities) for the character and the development of a birth chart are always close aspects of planets to Angles and House Cusps, and, secondly, close mutual aspects of planets with the Angles and House Cusps.

A recommended procedure for the delineation of all sorts of dirth charts Is to reduce the great number of Midpoints to those that have a purely Individual character (through connection with the Angles) and the use or small orbs for Mldpoint aspects.
To glve the reader the Dossibility of working with Prenatal Ecllpses, Tables for these are given in the Appendix for the United Kingdom and Sovlet Russla

A delineation of the traditional 1776 map seeméd to be quite approprlate for the characler of the United States, and a glance through the Ephemerls from 1800 on shows significant aspects for many main events. The Ascendant and Uranus played the princlpal role here, Irequently in conjunctions with transil ing planets

This map has been rejected by many astrologers: Two o.clock in the morning could not possibly be connected with the Constitution of a State, as people are usually asleep at this time. However speculations like these have often produced errors. 'Gray are all theories' sald wollgang von Goethe in his 'FAUST'.

As the writer has often mentloned, experlence !shows that the dellneation of a birth map alone is never a secure way to authenticate a birth time. This applies particularly to so-called "speculative- birth times but also to cases where we have the cholce Detween several dirferent times

## Authenticatian of the U.S. A. Chart as demonsirated with the State Horoscope of the United Kingdom

As the basis for my analysis I have provisionally fixed the birthtime of our U.S.A chart at 7 n 13 m Universal Time; July 4, 1776 For the astronomical elements a quite accurate computer program has been of immense help with results that can match the diflerent computer services

In addition to the necessary Ephemerides for events from 1850 on, Raphael's Tables of Houses for Northern Latiludes 00 to 590 are recommended This handy Dooklet allows one in the shortest possible time to plck the Angles for a computed Local Siderlal Time.

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Naturally, no conclusions can be reached from a single Chart, either as regards its authenticity or its capacity for rectification; a great number of charts have to be computed in this way.
With ( 1) a pocket calculator, (2) the appropriate Ephemeris* and (3) a Table of Houses for Pekin ${ }^{\bullet \bullet}$ always open and ready for use, it is possible to compute a large number of charts in a short time for this radix being discussed about 60 Lunars have been analysed in this way.

For the verification and approximate rectification of any natal chart, whether a personal or a mundane, we have to keep in mind that the significant planets with an appropriate symbolism for the particular event tend to be close to the Angles of a Cyclic Map. Experience also shows, that a large percentage of charts, if rectified, have appropriate planets (sometimes two, or even three) on the Angles of the Lunar Return figure, with an orb of one degree or less.

The true conjunction with Angles of any Cyclic Chart has to be considered in munoo, that Is, rising, setting, on the RAMC or the RAIC. In most cases however, the latitude of the planets is so small that it would be a waste of time to follow this procedure with each chart Instead, with a large number of events and corresponding Lunars avallable, we try to find the best possible position of the Angles in relation to these planets on an Ecliptical basis. In the present instance, the computed Lunars, with iew exceptions confirm :
(a) that the 1776 chart is effective and
(b) the best possible position for the Angles of the computed Lunar figure results from adding 20 m ( -5 I In RAMC) to our speculative time, 7 h 13 m . Adjusted provisional birth time - 7h 33m U.T.


Natal charts authenticated in this way can be worked for prediction with the Universal Transit-System '
(Transits, Prenatal Transits and Cycles, such as Solar and Lunar Returns).
An additional method to verify and adjust a natal chart is by Directions
from the Precessed (Sidereal) Solar Return, that Is, Progressed/Regressed factors to:
(a) Progressed (regressed) factors of the Solar Return, and /or
(b) Radical factors, with the Secondary measurement - 24 hours of Solar Progression or Regression $=1$ year. ${ }^{8}$

Here are the results, taking as a base the verified birth time of 7n 33 m U.T.

Examolel: The Precessed (Sidereal) Solar Retum for 1918, July 7. 16 h 48 m 10s (Washington), covering revolution and capitulation of the German Reich - 1918, November 9(11). Fig. 17
The SUN, MOON, MERCURY, VENUS, JUPITER and PLUTO high in the sky near the Midneaven, suppressing MARS on the ASC, is very characteristic of the. successful termination of a war.
We notice that the MOON at 6 Can 45 could by Regression reach Radical VENUS 2 Can 22, as four months had passed at the time of the German capitulation, from July until November. (The Moon's average apparent motion by Secondary Progression is one degree a month)

A glance at the Noon Ephemeris shows for 14 h 55m the 5in Plovember 1918. As the actual event occured on Nov. 9 , we have here a shorliall of four days, which corresponds approximately 1016 m in time. This shows that our provisional authentication of the USA birth time could possibly be somewhat later As identifications like these may have orbs of up to three days, we can conclude only that the true birth ! ime, which so far has been adjusted to 7 h 3 Jm should be very close to the true time. Final decisions can be taken If other Solar Return examples like this are analysed.

Aspects of other Solar Return planets to Solar-Return or Radical factors are also valid. but precision to a few seconds of arc for all planets involved is indispensable.
As extensively explained in Prediction 1 the Moon in these Progressions and Regressions is acting only as a catalyst. For instance, in Example I, the Regressed MOON conjunct Radical VENUS has to De interpreted simply by VENUS, here symbolizing peace. In Example 6, MARS symbolizes war enterprises. Over 20 examples of this kind have been demonstrated in Prediction I In the Chart of Queen Elizabeth II.

These Directions of the Precessed Solar Return, If malnly conjunctions or oppositions to Radical factors, are the best final proof for any rectification performed with Primary Directions in the Topocentric System.

Experience shows that State Horoscopes seldom have as many convincing Primary Directions as the horoscopes of individuals. This is because there is often more than one important date of foundation On the other hand the relatively shorter distance in time detween the Radix and the events gives priority to those State Horoscopes that are closer to the event being analyzed.

For this reason the Directions der ived from the Precessed Solar Return, although not giving rectified RAMC results with a precision of $:$ one minute of arc, have sometimes more weight as a final verification of the rectified chart than the Primary Directions themselves that reflect the events analyzed. This is because the ever true and simple symbolism of these Solar Return Directions and the aspect most frequently appearing the Conjunction - are convincing sclentific prools for their valtdity.
The same scientific proof is also evident from the fact that these DIrections, although derived from a Sidereal Chart give accurate and convincing results only if applled in the Tropical measurement. These and other phenomena, such as Transits applied to the Radix, should encourage Sidereal astrologers to approach Zodiacal problems in a more realistic way.

# The Refined Recilincollon via Primary Directions In the Topoceninic System 

## Enample :

The allack of the Japanese on Pear Harbour, Jecember 7, 1941, This was possibly the darkest day in the history of the United States.

There are a few very characteristic individualistic Indications, which strenghten the validity of this Chart:
NEPTUNE in Mundane conjunction with Cusp 5 (Orb 19) and in square to MARS. Thls position of Neptune may be related to the Civil War 18611865, as here it symbolizes war with associates.
Traditional interpretation which is not always reliable, would be :
NEPTUNE in Virgo ,Its Detriment, on Cusp 5, Ruler or House XI, = allies and Priends.
MARS rad near ASC in an almost exact trine to the MC and to the Radical MOON = wars expanding and consolidating the United States' power and influence.
JUPITER In Mundane conjunction with Cusp 2 (orb 18). - prosperity .
The flxed star DENEB ALGEDI (benefic) within $3^{\circ}$ of arc in R.A to the RAMC. DIMAH (benefic; 2®Canll') conj. VENUS rad(II'). ALHENA (beneflc, $5^{\circ}$ Can $5^{\circ}$ ) conJ. JUPITER rad( $11^{\circ}$ ) ALDEBRAAN (neutral) rising within 7m of time.

All the above mentioned fixed stars are of the First and Second Order, they are all close to the Ecllptic (small latitude.) and of a beneflc character. Fixed stars of the First Order, and perhaps Second Order, if they are very close to a Radical factor, as classified in Prediction III, should be taken into consideration because their importance is evident from their overwhelming irequency. This is very fortunate for our chances against coincidence, a factor that of ten has been neglected in astrology.

We have to emnhasize here that in the Radix, planets in Houses if not close to the Cusp itsell, do not necessarlly indicate Fate The reason Is that many people born on the same day, have similar House positions and planets - almost every twentieth person, in fact, whereas conjunctions with Cusps are individualistic, and practically without exception produce decisive events during the life time, with an appropriate symbolism.

Apart from anything else, this demonstration of the authentication and rectification of a birth chart should show that the main aim in astrological analysis is the achievement of an overwhelming factor of chance against coincidence.

As is generally appreciated, the best tools for this are Conjunctions and Oppositions. I advise the reader to make similar analyses in the same order as above, starting first with Precessed Lunar Returns.
The following astrological systems and factors are unsultable for the actual authentication or rectification :

1. Delineations of birth charts .
2. Transits, both postnatal and prenatal

3 Conjunctions of fixed stars.
4. Partner comparisons.

All the above only support the achieved rectification and should not be used a priori

We have already learned that Prenolol Eclipses and Lunations that are equivalent to the relevant postnatal ones are much more individualistic because they depend on the birth dates of the Radices in question. To demonstrate this on the USA Horoscope we present Eclipses that have replected extraordinary events in the United States' history

The reader will notice that the Angles of this Chart are almost Identical with those of the USA : Chart.

In this Chart too, the assumption of USA astrologers has been realized a characteristic Ascendant in Tropical Geminl. It follows, of course, that the Angles of both the 1776 and the 1789 Charts will have almost IdentIcal Transits In this active Chart, with six planets around the MC, the Paran of VENUS and PLUTO with a preceding MARS is the most powerful configuration (Venus and Pluto on the MC In Right Ascension, with orbs under one degree). Undoubtedly these three planets are most characterist Ic for all sorts of wars, of which the Unlted States fought a considerable number.
The 1100 N in House XII, near the ASC, supports GemInian characterlstics of the United States. To a certain extend it may be regarded as an indlvidual factor because of its quick apparent movement. The SUN, although high in the sky, is weakend by its close conjunction with SATURN. The latter, Ruler of the 8th and the 9th cusp, brought long-lasting difficultles In forelgn affairs, with some declsive fallures, misjudgements and disadvantageous hesitations, such as at the Blockade of Berlin, the Korean and Vietnam Wars.

The SUN also represents the Head of State, here the President. It Is a matter of opinion whether the form of government established by the Constitution has proved to be an advantageous one. At least, during the last decades, it frequently happened that nelther the nomination of the candidates for Presidency nor the judgement of the people at the elections (MOON squared by SUN and SATURN) have been under a lucky omen. There might be more troubles with USA Presidents in future because the Ascendant is squared by the SUN-SATURN conjunction. The condition of the SUN (President) In Pisces, symbolizes * Watergate* as well, perhaps, as the Iran-Nicaragua Affair

The posslbillties for the Civil War (1861-1865) are symbollzed by NEPTUNE (Detriment) In House $V$ and Ruler of XI (assoclates, irlends) In an almost exact quincunx to both the 1 ith Cusp and MERCURY. JUPITER in II promises some prosperity and ( trine SUN- SATURN) a certaln stabllity of the executive power.

The position of NEPTUNE In LIbra, with a close trine to the MC, shows an admirable tolerance in rellglous matters since the existence of this Constitution, and an evident disposition for other Neptunlan matters (sects) on an esoteric and superstitious base. The MC in Aquarlus symbolizes the United States as an avant-gard In matters of technical advance and comfort (VENUS conj. MC).
The position of URANUS Is debatable. Although it is not aspected by other planets, a certain strength has to be admitted because of its position near an Angle. As a neutral planet, Ruler of the MC, and In a close sesquiquadrate to the Ascendant (Orb 16), it might have given some positive Impulses in progress, tolerance and in the fight for clvil rights. However a princlpal Direction for the disaster of Pearl Harbour, URANUS converse conJ. MC rad, shows that Uranus, if Directed (here to Its domicile, the MC ) may also produce negatlve events.
As usual, effectlve State Horoscopes as well as Horoscopes of famous or Infamous individuals show principal flxed stars In Ecliptical conjunctions with Radical planets and Mundane conjunctlons with Angles of the chart. In our case, the MC is conjunct DENEB ALGEDI, a fixed star of the second order (orb 10). The following flxed stars of the first order could have played a certain role in USA history. Contrary to the statements of some contemporary astrologers, supported by eminent astrologers or the Middle Ages and an overwhelming number of serious present-day astrologers, the writer has to emphazise here that the Tropical Solar Return is very much superior to the Precessed Solar Return (Sidereal Solar Return - SSR) as regards the depiction of the principal events in the Solar Year. On the other hand, If one is using Siderial Solars, the writer recommends analyzing the Demi-Solar Return and the two Quarti-Solar Returns ${ }^{13}$ in addition to the main Solar Return Chart. These Charts of shorter duration, and nearer to the event, reflect the native's psychological condition at the operational time and also, of course, events connected with it.

The writer has carefully studied the history of the Soviet Union and has come to the conclusion that the following important three dates should be worthwhile analyzing for a corresponding Chart:

1. The first meeting of the Parliament after the withdrawal of the Kerenski Government. 1917, November 7 (Oct. 25 in the Old Style Calender)
2. Lenin announced the Revolution of the Boisheviks (Soviet party) in the second Parliament meeting and proclaimed his program
1917, November 8 . The majority of Parliamęnt members, Liberals, Menshlwiks and different Socialists left the meeting because of protest. This allowed the Bolsheviks to cease power, at first in Petrograd (Leningrad), and later in the major cities of European Russia. A similar event occured on January 30, 1933, when Adolf Hitler as the appointed Cnancelor of State, took over the Government and selzed full power, although at that t ime he did not have the majority of voters on this side.

3 The Union of Socialistic Soviet Republics, USSR, as in its present form, was created December 30, 1922

So far the writer has succeeded only in authenticating the two Charts of November 7 and 8 , the latter giving better results.

# The Verification of the Acfrieved Pectufication via Precessed Lunar Returns 

as demonstrated in detail in the Map of the United States of America.

In all kinds or Lunar Returns, it is appropriate to analyze only Mundane conjunctions, oppositions and squares, according to the character of the Angles, MC, IC, ASC and DESC.

The writer has frequently stated that in view of a considerable number of Cycles available, our analysis and evaluation of these maps should be restricted to Angulor Mundane aspects.
Here we have to dist Inguish between:
a) Single planets being in close Mundane conjunction with one of the Angles. The MC (RAMC) has always the greatest power. Planets that are very close to the Midheaven dominate over those which are on one of the other Angles.
b) More than one Angular planet.

For instance, Saturn in close conjunction with the MC always dominates over Jupiter on one of the other Angles in a Mundane Opposition (IC) or in squares (ASC,DESC) if no other benevolent or neutral planet such as an angular SUN, MERCURY or VENUS supports JIPITER.

Generally speaking, it is the pattern of the horoscope that plays an important role in the nature and efficacy of a Cyclic Chart. This applies also to the delineation of Radices. A concentration of planets in the First and Second Quadrants ( $\mathrm{X}-\mathrm{I}-\mathrm{IV}$ ) of the horoscope expresses activity of the native, no matter whether the results are positive or negative. in contrast to this, an assembly of planets on the West side of the chart. (IV - VII-X) shows introvert behavior, that is, inactivity. At the same time and in general, notable assemblies of planets above the horizon reflect energy, while many planets under the horizon often indicate weakness of the psyche and body, resulting in illinesses. This is aggravated if the SUN is at its weakest point, that is, near the I.C. Or course, ilinesses can also be reflected, if. for instance, an assembly of malefics is around the MC, and the benevolent planets occupy the lower part of the horoscope. In this case, however, the ilinesses are mostly connected with unfortunate events, like loss of work, etc. On the other hand, an assembly of planets around the MC, with planets in the 9th House is a very powerful configuration, even if some of the planets are not very close to the MC.

It is an old and true rule that a chain of planets, if they are not too distant from one another, gives the horoscope a decisive character according to the symbolism of this planetary accumulation. Such chains or accumulations of planets on other Angles of the chart are also valid, but of less effect. Of importance, also, are configurations where the Angles form a Midpoint between the planets

As demonstrated above, the writer has used the traditional form of computing Parans, that is, measuring the distance of planets on the MC and IC in Right Ascension, risings and settings in ODlique Ascension/ Descension for the geographic latitude, disregarding the Poles of the planets involved.

In the more ref ined evaluation of a birth chart, it is a logical consideration that the Mundane character of planets depends on their Oblique Ascension or Descension, rather than their Zodiacal position. So far, the writer has not been able to prove elther astronomical measurement in Cyclic Charts because the difference between them is too small when considering planets close to the Angles. On the other hand, the traditional form is much less complicated.
The number of effective Lunar Returns for any event varies between four and eight: (1) The Precessed Lunar, (2) its Prenatal equivalent, (3) The Secondary (Natal Quotidian) Lunar, (4) its Prenatal Equivalent and, in special cases (when the event is distant from the Lunar Retum date), the corresponding Demi Lunars for all four Charts. Because of this it is sometimes difficult to recognize psychological expressions and the events which could be the cause. For prediction we use the Overlap Method ${ }^{15}$.
The following never-failing rule may help the reader:
Events and the strength of Lunars, can always be traced by
(a) a sufficient number of Angular planets and
(b) the closeness of the planets to the Angles.

This is demonstrated with the Lunar Returns below.
A precondition for the realization of main events is, of course, the maturing of Primary and Secondary Directions, during the operational period of the Lunar Returns.

This Radix better suits the turbulent time period which the Bolsheviks experienced in the first years of their dictatorship. It is therefore remarkable that the efficacy of this Chart extended as far as the Summit Conference, December 8, 1987.
The ASCENDANT in $6^{9}$ Leol2 ${ }^{\circ}$ is closely connected with NEPTUNE, rising within 2 degrees and in Mundane conjunction with the fixed star SOUTH ASELLUS.

South Asellus, a fixed star of the third order has shown its efficacy in several horoscopes that have been analyzed by the writer. This is mainly because it has almost no latitude ( $0^{\circ} \mathrm{N} \mathrm{04}{ }^{\circ}$ ). In horoscopes of individuals especially in conjunction with Neptune and the ASC ( as here), it has been involved in gas poisoning and in fatal infectious Illnesses (horoscopes of 1917-1919).
The Sorlet State of the Bolsheviks, as can be seen, was obviously "not born under a lucky star." The most negative aspect is perhaps the close square of the SUN to SATURN. This afflicted Sun (head of state) within one degree of the 5th Cusp and in opposition to the ilth, reflects the cruel and unjust executions of loyal communists during the years in which Jossip Stalin eliminated his best friends and former supporters.

The square of MERCURY (closely connected with the Sun-Saturn aspect) to the 2nd Cusp (orb $15^{\circ}$ ) reflects the poor living standard of the Soviet population, especially because Saturn in the First House. Is near the 2nd CUSD. JUPITER, the most elevated planet in this Horoscope is in Its Detriment, Gemini, and is also in a close square to the Radical MOON. As experience shows, Jupiter in its Detriment often perverted law. In the present case, the population (MOON) have suflered terribly from it. Several millions of Russians were executed or sent to hard labour in concentrat ion camps, from which only a few returned.
Soviet Russia was a country that had to endure extreme suffering through wars. Not counting the casuallties during the civil wars (1917-1922). the number of which can hardly be judged, the number of Russian casualtties in World War II has been estimated at 13 millions soldiers and 7 millions of the civil population.

The losses of military personel and civilians for the other nations involved in World War 11 is estimated at about 13.5 million. The wars of the USSR have been cruel and involved great suffering. They all ended in victory, however, because VENUS (Cusp 6), MARS and PLUTO (Cusp XII) are in close harmonious asdect. NEPTUNE, the dominant planet because of its Angularity, has given a special slant to the character of the Nation.


The State has always been suspicious of other countries and the ir people, controlling all communication systems to foreign countries. To expect all foreigners to be sples is (or at least was before Gorbachev) a well-known mania of the Soviet State. The authorities' mistrust of their people, and the denunciations of citizens to the police, are also very characteristic of NEPTUNE on the Ascendant.

## Secondary Directlons Derived from the Precessed Solar Heturn Demonsirated with a New SImplifled Method

The usual computation of exact Secondary Progressions and Regressions ${ }^{D}$ using astronomical constants such as, the Universal Time of the Solar Return, the Progressed UT and Sidereal Time, easily causes errors in computation.

The following recently developed simplified method gives results with sufficient accuracy:

Obviously this MOON -JUPITER conjunction is assoclated with the Cuba Crisis, which has to be judged as disadvantageous, at least for the USSR, although peace was preserved. The writer has àlready repeatedly stated that the Dignlty and Fall of planets in Radices can only be evaluated in the traditional way if we have to deal with Individuals who made history, or with State Horoscopes. In our USSR Chart Radicaliluplter is in Its weakest Sign, Gemini, squared by the Radical MOON. This MOON/JUPITER square is repeated in our demonstrated Solar Return (.MOON 22 GEM - JUPITER $25^{2}$ Virgo ). Jupiter is in Virgo, a Sign with which it does not associate well. In other words, Jupiter has a very pure quality here in all its comblnations.

This is an lllustrative example of Jean Baptist Morin's theorles. Jupiter afflicted, in unfavourable Signs may reflect unfavourable events. The writer has frequently glven examples of this (Eichmann, Hitler).

In the same way, Solar Directions may be computed with other maturing Dlanets, using the multipller 0.95827 ( $350 / 365.24$ )

Sometimes it is more approprlate to make a reverse computation. This can be recommended for all cases where simply the date of maturation is required.

The Precessed Prenatal Solar does not show sufficient characteristics as regards thls event, except the afflicted JUPITER close to the Descendant and the MOON in a low position on the IC. Because of these positions : and aspects the above demonstrated MOON/JUPITER Direction has special weight. MERCURY, here in its Detriment (Sagittarius), is in opposition to Radical Jupiter (detriment). A further link for the negative outcome of the MARS/MERCURY and MOON/JUPITER DIrectlons.

Quite Impressive charts have also been achleved with the USSR Chart of Nouember 7, 1917. Fig E. About 40 charts analyzed for main events, and a considerable number of Primary Directions, gave an authentication and secure rectification of this State Horoscope, which represents the Proclamation of the Russian Revolution. For reasons of space it is not possible to include here a similar analysis as with the Chart of Nov. 8 . The reader is invited to analyze this Chart with the Summit (disarmament agreement), Decemiber 8, 1987, 19n 02m 25s - 19h 05m 50s UT, for Washington.

The vitallty of West Berlin is persuasively shown by the assembly of all eleven Horoscope factors ( Sun - Node) in the East half of the Map. Its successful fight up to present for its Independence is symbolized by MARS high in the the sky in the 10th House.

As with most rectifled horoscopes of V.I.P.'s (Individuals), the Radlx of West Berlin ( Fig F) shows a remarkable number of effective prominent fixed stars, which have no doubt supported the city in a most benefic manner. A glance at the Horoscope shows many afflictions such as MARS in close square to the ASCENDANT and the MDON, while JUPITER in Virgo and at a weak point of the Chart - In the middle of the 2nd House - is amellorated only by its conjunction with the Part of fortune. The close trine of MARS to JUPITER (or'b $3^{\circ}$ ) Is only small help because of the pure quality of both planets.

These principal features, and the permanent threat of Soviet Russla, encouraged astrologers to predict a very short life for West Berlin.

They have all been mistaken, however. The presence of prominent ilxed stars in conjunction malnly with Angles, the Sun and the Moon produces Fate in the pure sense, especially in the horoscopes of States and politiclans. The Radix of West Berlin is one of the examples where benevolent fixed stars have activated this critical but extrovert and vital Chart (all planets on the East side of the Horoscope).

The MC of West Berlin coincides with the IC of East Germany. 180-degree links of this kind are fortunate only in ASC- DESC combinations in special cases.

## The Blockade of Wesl Berlin 1948, June 23

was preceded by a monetary reform in both parts of occupied Germany.
Prenotal Solor Eclipse of 1942, August 12, 2h 27 m UT, corresponds to June 13, 1948, and went into operation 10 days before the event. Fig. 41 The Eclipse falls on the Radical Ascendant of West Berlin, which in general promises an event of importance. PLUTO on the Ascendant of the Eclipse is very characteristic, as the event opened a new economic era.

Tropical Solar 1947. July $12 \quad 17 \mathrm{~h} 30 \mathrm{~m} 16 \mathrm{~s}$ UT (not reproduced) URANUS may be regarded as the most prominent planet, descending within two degrees, and symbolizing the suddeness of the event. To some extiend it also symbolizes the support of the United States (Gemini). SATURN near Cusp 8 is conjunct Radical PLUTO within $6^{\circ}$ of arc and symbolizes the Blockade. The Angular MOON, conjunct the Radical MC (23') and very low in the Horoscope, near the IC, reflects the frustrations that the people of West Berlin şulfered for almost a year. MARS, $80 G e m 10^{\circ}$, Cusp 6, here the agressor (Soviet Russia which caused the Blockade), is conjunct ALDEBARAN, 90 03' $20^{\circ} \mathrm{Gemini}$, a violent fixed star of the first order.
> - The Woll - 1961. August 13-the most negative and sad event in West Berlin's and West Germany's history.
> For West Berlin the most characteristic Cyclic Chart is the

Solor Eclipse 1961, August 11 10h 35m 43s UT Fig. 42,
which started operat ing just two days before the event. Again, as in the Prenatal Solar Eclipse for the Blockade, the occultation occured on the Radical ASC of West Berlin's Chart. The MC is conjunct Radical PLUTO within $10^{\circ}$ of arc. In the Chart of East Germany, which has similar coor dinates to West Berlin, this Ecllpse falls on MARS ( $188^{\circ}$ Leo $37^{\circ}$ ) and PLUTO (178 Leo 46 ).
This is another example of the immense efficacy of Solar Eclipses if they appear in conjunctions with Radical factors, especially with Angles, as in the present case.

The Horoscope of Best Germany (F.R.G.) does not show any afflictions that could leed to an extreme dest iny, either successful or disastrous. The most powerful celestial bodies here are the Angular planets MOON. JUPITER and NEPTUNE. It was the authority (SUN) of East Germany (FIg. H) that so of ten obstructed a peaceful coexistence of both States. The SUN of West Germany in House VIII has always falled to show sufficlent energy and resistance against the influence of other polftical powers. This was sometimes aggravated by an unsultable or unnecessary acceptance of USA politics. Nevertheless, the almost exact trine of the Sun to Jupiter (Orb $2^{\circ}$ ) has enhanced the importance of this State among its assoclated European countries.
The NEPTUNE /MOON opposition from ASC to DESC has to be regarded as unfavourable. There is no doubt that the Moon and Neptune of West Germany, with the ir close squares to the Sun of East Germany, have caused many oroblems and tenstons in the retationship of the two States. The effect is, however, soltened to a large extend by harmonlous aspects of MERCURY, VENUS and PLUTO. MERCURY in its Oomiclle, Gemini, high in the sky and on Cusp IX, because of its conjunction with VEriUS has to a great extend contributed to:vards West Gemmanys wealth and its achlevement of first place in the economic power of the European Economic Community. As with the Radlx of West Eerlin, where Priendship and protection are symbolized by Cusp XI, Uranus and Geminl, the 9th Cusp here with Mercury and Venus also in Gerninl is playing a simllar frlendly role in the relationship with the United States. This Is clearly shown, especially in the 1776 map of the U.S.A

The llorascope of Easl Germany (G.D.R., FIG. H), because of its SUN high in the sky In the 9th House, has a greater power than the Sun of West Germany in the 8 th House. However this Sun Is not as favourable as it might look at first glance. The very close conjunction of the SUN with NEPTUNE obstructs the activities of this State in relation to forelgn countries, and makes It dependent on the East Block and Soviet Russia. (The writer is not yet persuaded that Corimunism is represented by NEPTUNE alone, which is a common assumption.)

As we all know, most communist-orlented States in the world lack the democratic rights that we enjoy, Ilving in the iree Western World. The suppression of the people is very persuasively shown by the SUN (authorlties) suppressing the MOON (people) below the Horizon and near the I.C. The close conjunction of the SUN/MOON (Full Moon) opposition with the Mean Noce Indicates that there had been an Ecllose of the Moon the very same day (without any significance for the foundation of this State).

As pointed out in a previous chapter, in State Horoscopes victorles, defeats and peace treatles, are events that usually show the most characteristic and dynamic astrological reflections. This is logical as these events concern the psyche of the whole nation, whereas even catastrophies where a considerable number of people are involved are more or less confined to the place of the happenings. To an extend, a certain dynamic can also be expected when the death of a monarch or statesman occurs.
In the case of catastroohies. Cycles are always more Impressive if they are computed for the place or territory of the happening. Let us analyze with Primary and Secondary Directions the Anglo-Argentinian war In1982. the dates of which are given above.
The most characteristic Directions are those with Mars (4) assoclated with the MC, ASC, VENUS and PLUTO. The sextile of the Regressed MC to NEPTUNE, perhaps symbolizing a war at sea, in connection with the accumulations of the Directions, unfavourable throughout, may be regarded as negative too.

The writer has repeatedly stated that soft aspects like trines and sextiles involving maleflcs, often produce negative results, especially if, as in this casc, the maleflc (here Neptune in Sagittatarlus conjunct the 3rd Cusp and square PLUTO) suffers poor Cosmic conditions in the Radix.

In this Chart the most significant features are the aspects of planets to Radical factors and the Paran of MARS (high in the sky) opp. NEPTUNE in IV, symbolizing the loss of the War at Sea. S.R MARS square Radical PLUTO ( $8^{\prime}$ ) (see Secondary Direction Regressed MARS semisquare PLUTO); URANUS/NEPTUNE - Midpoint MC/IC
10. The Prenatal Trapical Solar covering the Solar 1981/82. Fig. 50 1651 July 9, igh 35m 5is UT, shows a number of Solar planets in aspect to the Radix. The MOON, MARS and SATURN in a T-Square afflict the Radical MC axis as well as the SUN and MOON, with orbs around one degree. The close Solar conjunctions of VENUS/PLUTO (war) and URANUS/NEPTUNE are also characteristic.. Here, NEPTUNE, with an orbltal period of 164.8 years, In an exact quincunx (3) to the SUN, has almost reached Its Radical position in 165 years ( 1651 - 1816). The same, applies to NEPTUNE in the corresponding Tropical Solar above (Fig. 49). Here Neptune touches the 3ro Radical Cusp (opposite Cusp 9 ) within $43^{\prime}$ of arc.
2. The MODN Eclipse of 1982, Jan. 9, 19h 53m UT (not reproduced) is also remarkable. This Eclipse is within 1 of are in conjunction with the Radical Moon and totally obscurs the SUN/MOON opposition axis in the Radix. Besides this we observe a descending URANUS and PLUTO conjunct the Radical DESCENDANT ( 18 ).
The writer's experience to date indicates that the effectiveness of Moon Eclipses is limited to those that precede the event by not more than 28 days, while the efficacy of Sun Eclipses extend to a full Solar year it is a matter of research to decide whether Moon Eclipses may exercise a longer period of efficacy than the period of one full Moon circult.

## 3. Prenatal Solar Eclipse 1650, October 25, 4n 13.5m UT Fig. 51 corresponding to the postnatal date of 1982 , March 23.

The Eclipse falls on Radical JUPITER ( orb 1.5 9), which at first seems encouraging. However, the only success Argentina had, was the occupation of the Falkland Islands on April 2. The fallure, resulting in a complete defeat, Is clearly reflected by the following unfavourable Indications:
The Eclipse is in the Chart's most unfavourable position, that is, near the IC. VENUS, URANUS, NEPTUNE (all three planets almost exactly in a semisq to Radical JUPITER ) are conjunct in a Paran and in opposition to PLUTO (Paran). Except for rising SATURN and PLUTO, the planets under the Horizon symbolize the weakness of the State.

The following longer lasting Transits were decisively involved in the demonstrated events
A) Posinatal Iransils (covering the period April I to June 15, 1982)

PLUTO 26 Libra-24 Libra, and powerful because retrograde (that is slow in motion), was in the vicinity of the radical Ascendant during the whole period.

VIII: Taking posession of territories (or losing them) through inheritance ( as often happened in the history of Europe). General losses of property. unfavourable monatery reforms, inflation. With JUPITER and/or the SUN, commemoration dzys, memorial services

IX : Foreign countries, and activitles there, such as wars and sporting events

# PRETLCTLON in PRACTLCE <br> Possibilities and Limitations 

Generally speaking, the same astrologlcal tools should be used in forecasts as in the analysis of past events demonstrated above. A rellable forecast of coming events can be quite successful with so-called speculative events. This applies to personal as well to as mundane astrology.
In speculative forecasts we distingulish between -
(a) Events that are fixed beforehand to known dates, and
(b) Events that could be expected according to previous occurences.

Under (a) fall all sorts of electlons, Summit conferences and Important sport ing events such as the World Soccer Oup.
On the other hand, if astrology is used as a gulde, It would be possible to fix advantageous dates for enterprises such as, for instance, the start of space ships and missiles, or the beginning of negotlations.
This form of forecast was successiully exerclsed by the anclent astrologers who, in those times (Assyrla, Eabylonla, Egypt), had the beneflt of the confldence of their rulers.

As to present, there have been rumours that astrologers were Involved in fixing the day for the Invasion of the Continent by the Allied Forces (D-Day, 1944, June 6).
Under (D) fall forcasts for the outcome of negotiations, a task that is more complicated because the development and duration of such processes cannot be flxed beforehand. 12
More risky, and perhaps from the ethical point of view objectionable, are forecasts that relate to the deaths of V.I.P.'s., espectally of Rulers of States. This is possible where old age or Illness allows a speculative prediction, particularly if there are other rectified charts of relatives avallable. Analysis of the horoscope of the individual concerned, together with the chart of the State involved, offers a high probability of success.
As a practical example of (a) the writer cites his successful analysis preceding the Disarmement Agreement between President Reagan and Miknall Gorbachev.

## Final Remarks

In the present era, the Improved techniques in astrology, last but not least through the Invention of computers, should enable the astrologer to approach all astrological problems in a different, more progressive way.

In this respect we would like to draw the reader's attention to considerations which, as far as possible, ellminate coincidence and flction. Unfortunately, as explained In Prediction. III, our Century has produced a lot of fictional astrological systems with a superfluous number of factors that cannot be controlled.

The simplest, but highly effective tools for every astrologer should be a comprehensive application of the Universal Transit System, where the varlous Precessed Lunar Returns, especially, are of great Importance because they are easy to compute and their application and interpretation does not result in too many failures. As repeatedly stated, the evaluation of these Cycles depends solely on planets that are near the Angles. The Interpretation of Transits and Cycles is explained in Prediction I.

The eflectiveness of Precessed Lunar Returns, In particular, is obvious enough to neglect any statistical considerations. However, there are two simple ways to prove the efficacy of these charts. Apart from astrological indications, which show the appropriate planets on the Angles signlficant for an event, or corresponding psychological experiences, we can appreclate that the appearence of planets near the Angles of a Cycle are not a mere matter of chance. We Invite the reader to compare the Cycles demonstrated in this book with ordinary charts of average Indiulduals. Only in very exceptional cases will there be such impressive charts, In view of characteristics and dynamics.

To prove these Cycles in a serlous statistical way, I recommend a method that we may call the substitutional method. It does not require any preliminary considerat lons about chances. For instance, we may mathematically compare 50 elfective cycles with 50 birth charts of individuals, and exploit statistically the frequencies of planets near the Angles with their varying distances.

Or, to exclude any doubts of manlpulation, we could replace the birth charts with 50 dummles, which result from choosing for all cycles corresponding dummy charts, and which, for instance, are separated by one month irom these Cycles.

The statistical evaluation has to be performed with a Contigency Table analysis and the Chi-Square test in order to achieve a favourable Probability Factor. We invite the experts in statistics to make such an attempt on effective Cyclic Charts, especlally on Precessed Lunar Returns.

Much simpler is a comparison between the Tropical (Solar System) and the Sidereal (fixed heaven) measurement. It is a fact that Transits measured in our Solar System, that Is, on the Ecliptic, glve much closer results than the Sidereal measurement, if applled in aspects to the birth chart. To test this, we recommend using event.s of well-authenticated State Horoscopes, such as the 1801 Map bp the United Kingdom. Here, for the year 1988, Transits measured in the Sidereal Zodiac appear with extended orts (Precession for 187 years $-2937^{\prime}$ ), while in the Tropical measurement the approprlate aspects are always quite close.

The alm of astrological research should be to put astrology on a real scientiflc base. Unfortunately, a great number of astrologers regard astrology as an art (as they say), denying its direct undoubted relationship to the world of sciences. This lllogical classification not only offends against all the wonderful productlon's in the arts that have been created during the centurles, but also shows that these astrologers lack a really constructive mind. Many of them take refuge in phllosophy, esoterics and other matters that are changeable or perishable, and closely connected with the planet NEPTUNE. Everything that works with measurements can be irue, and be a real sclence (MERCURY, .UPITER, URANUS), or false - fiction, (MERCURY, NEPTUNE).

Psychology and psychoanalysis, which do not have measurements, and are based on empiric assumptions, are recognized as sciences and are taught at most Universities, despite the controversial methods used. It is about time that astrology, with its facilitles now for faster research, should speed up to give the lle to all those sclentists who, with some justlfication, put astrology in the field of superstition.
